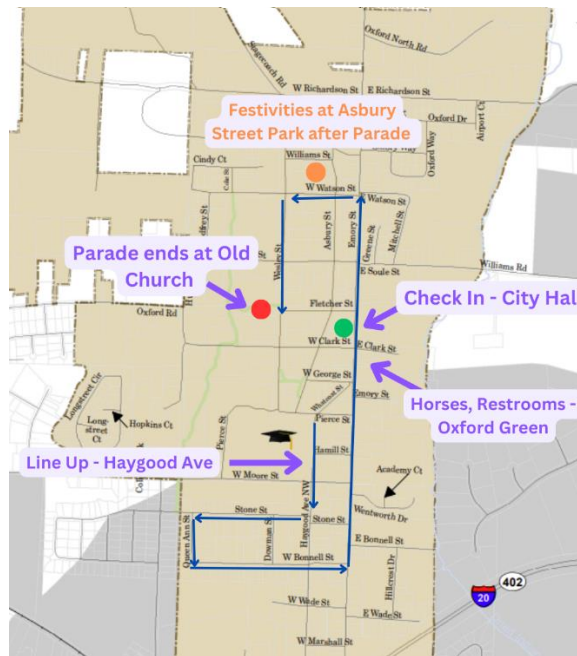
IF YOU WANT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PARADE, YOU MUST PREREGISTER BY JUNE 26, 2023.

Rules and Regulations

- 1) Operators of vehicles in the parade must have a valid and appropriate Georgia Driver's License and must be over the age of 18. No tractor trailers allowed or mobile homes/recreational vehicles.
- 2) All children riding on floats and vehicles must be accompanied by an adult.
- 3) It is requested that all entries be decorated in a holiday theme.
- 4) Participants who act or use music or language that is deemed offensive by the organizers (City of Oxford and Oxford Lions Club) will be removed from the parade.
- 5) All entries must be lined up and in position as directed by the committee no later than 9:00 a.m. – NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 6) One decorated float is allowed per commercial entry, unless granted prior approval by the committee.
- 7) **Candy cannot be thrown during the parade – NO EXCEPTIONS.** Walkers through the parade route can **pass** (not throw) candy or favors.
- 8) Drivers of all vehicles will adhere to parade committee instructions at all times and will follow the directions of the parade route, maintaining a distance of 30 feet between vehicles.
- 9) Participants must display parade number issued at check-in.
- 10) All animals must be on a leash or rein at all times.
- 11) Liability Waiver must be signed by all members of group.

Parade Route

New route this year- Parade begins on Haygood Street, turns right onto Stone Street, left onto Queen Ann Street, left onto W Bonnell Street, left onto Emory Street, left on W. Watson Street, and left onto Wesley Street where the parade will end at Old Church. Festivities to follow at Asbury Street Park after the parade. **Check-In begins at 8:00 a.m. at Oxford City Hall. You will be directed to line up on Haygood Avenue. All registered entrants must be in line by 9:00 a.m. Judging of entries will begin PROMPTLY at 9:00 a.m.**
