- Legislative Study Committee working on a "Plan B" found that a minimum of \$1.0 to \$1.5 billion in "new annual transportation infrastructure investment" is needed.
- The Study Committee listed twelve "Funding Options" to accomplish this task of raising revenue.





 GMA Executive Director Lamar Norton served on the Study Committee, and reported to GMA Membership that he "could not sign the report for one simple reason: it includes language that suggests taking or restricting revenues that fund local priorities."





- "Look to long term solutions to wean the state and local governments from use of sales taxes on gasoline for non-transportation purposes, while also taking into account local governments' present long-term bond obligations and their need for tax revenue to meet their own local transportation needs."

Deed Filing

• Current state law requires that a deed be filed within 90 days of a foreclosure.

• GMA is working with the General Assembly on legislation that will impose penalties on banks or investors that do not follow the law.





Municipal Tort Claims Act

- Cities and counties have different levels of sovereign immunity.
- When cities and counties participate in joint projects or jointly provide services, if something goes wrong, counties can walk away and cities are left with all of the liability
- A Tort Claims Act would provide cities with more certainty and cap liability.





Increasing Truck Weight

- Last year there was legislation to allow heavier trucks on roads maintained by local governments.
- Heavier trucks cause more damage to infrastructure and property and represents a financial and public safety issue.
- GMA would like local law enforcement officers to have the ability to perform roadside safety inspections on trucks.

Police Body Cameras

 GMA is supportive of municipal officers wearing cameras, but GMA is opposed to any unfunded mandates requiring the purchase of such equipment.

F.A.C.T. Act

(Full Accountability in Collection of Taxes Act)

- Sales tax data is more important now than ever before in order for a city to be competitive and plan for the future.
- Representative Paul Battles and GMA are holding a series of meetings with DOR and the business community to come up with an improved model of data sharing.





Municipal Court Judges

The Municipal Court Judges Council and the Judicial Council of Georgia will be supporting legislation that would:

- Make municipal courts "courts of record" and give them the power to grant new trials;
- <u>Mandate</u> that municipal courts have prosecuting attorneys; and
- Provide municipal court judges with a property interest in employment and only allow for them to be fired with cause.

Monday is Crossover Day

Monday, March 3, is "Crossover Day," the last day a bill can pass over from one chamber to the other. GMA encourages city officials to review the list of bills below and contact their House and Senate members about any legislation that is of concern.

Action Needed on Sovereign Immunity and Fractional SPLOST

HB 1010, Sovereign Immunity, by Barry Fleming (R-Harlem) is scheduled to be heard on the House floor on Monday, March 3. This bill would give cities the same level of sovereign immunity as counties and the state.

As cities and counties partner on delivering services and on brick and mortar projects in an effort in enhance efficiency, it is becoming common that they operate joint facilities and work through joint authorities to serve shared constituents. There is increased concern that city taxpayers are being held responsible for any liability for negligence, regardless of blame, in joint service agreements and projects, while counties are granted sovereign immunity. This bill ensures that city taxpayers are not shouldering the burden of lawsuits.

Under the Gold Dome

GMA needs city officials to contact their Senators on three bills this morning.

Municipal home-rule will be at stake in the Senate Judiciary Non-Civil Committee today, Tuesday, March 11, at 1:00 pm, when HB 875, Allowing Firearms in Government Buildings & Increased Lawsuits, by Rep. Rick Jasperse (R-Jasper), is heard. The ability of cities to determine whether firearms should or should not be allowed in city buildings is in jeopardy. GMA encourages city officials to contact their Senate member(s) and let them know that your city opposes the following two provisions in the bill:

1. HB 875 would allow a person to successfully bring a lawsuit against a city. an
